Non- emergency cases	Treatment is free of charge if you show your European Health Insurance Card and passport.
	Consult a doctor working at any healthcare institution that has contract with territorial health insurance funds. Full list of such healthcare institutions is here: http://www.vilniaustlk.lt/index.php?id=388&aid=1
	We recommend choosing large multi-function public healthcare institutions called poliklinika .
European Health	With European Health Insurance Card (EHIC) you have access to medically necessary , state-provided healthcare.

Dental care	Important: Around 80% of the dentists in Lithuania have a private practice, meaning that charges for their services are NOT covered by EHIC.
	Only in public healthcare institutions dental care is partially free (to be precise: treatment is free, but you are charged for any materials used, e.g. filling). The waiting lines however are very long (approx 1 month)
	Emergency room for dental care (they give injections for pain-relief, free of charge): Vilniaus Universiteto ligoninės Žalgirio klinika address: Žalgirio g. 117, Vilnius.
	Work hours: everyday from 20:00 to 8:00; weekends: 24 hours a day.
